Day 1 Fly from your hometown to Los Angeles. Board flight to Cairns (Via Sydney or Brisbane)

Day 2 Cross International Dateline

Day 3 **Welcome to Cairns, Australia / Afternoon Free**

Arrive in Cairns midday. You will be met at the airport and given a private transfer to your hotel in Cairns. Afternoon is free to relax or explore the Cairns city area.

Accommodation: Cairns Harbour Lights, One Bedroom – 4 Nights

Day 4 **Outer Barrier Reef Cruise**

(L)

Today visit just a wee part of the 1,200 mile-long Great Barrier Reef – the only living thing which can be seen from outer space! The Reef is 2 hours offshore. Speed there on the Quicksilver, a high-speed catamaran, to Agincourt Reef. Enroute, there will be marine biology presentations. Upon arrival, you can snorkel, take an introductory dive,



or ride in a semi-submersible coral viewer (Additional cost). Buffet lunch is served on board and you will be transferred back to your hotel at the tour conclusion.

Day 5 **Daintree & Cape Tribulation**

(L)

Departing your accommodation travel through the rich farming areas toward the World Heritage Listed forest region of Cape Tribulation. Step aboard our own personalized craft for a cruise on the mirrored smooth waters of the Daintree River. We cruise close to riverbanks and under the overhead canopy

of the rainforest seeking out the vivid Ulysees Butterfly, Kingfishers and various other wildlife. Arriving on the northern side of the river enter the

Cape Tribulation section of the Wet Tropics World Heritage protected rainforest. Journey over the beautiful Alexandra Range passing through rainforest waterfalls and on to our first stop for home-style morning tea deep in the rainforest at the Jindalba boardwalk. Continue along the Cape Tribulation road, stop at the magical Thornton Beach. The guides will highlight the amazing wildlife and ecosystems unique to this part of the world – “where the rainforest meets the sea”.



Lunch is a special treat today, deep under the Rainforest canopy. We enjoy a delicious lunch of tropical rainforest-inspired local produce. This is a unique opportunity to enjoy quality food, whilst bathed in the serenity of the Tropical Rainforests..

After lunch, visit a exotic tropical fruit orchard. Here, depending upon the season, you will get to see unusual,

exotic fruit originating from all over the globe's tropical regions. Along with the fruit trees the orchard is also a host to beautiful species of tropical flowering plants, both native and introduced.

The last stop and final lasting impression will be at the outstanding panoramic picture postcard view at Alexandra Range Lookout. From here you'll have a spectacular view of the mouth of the Daintree River, Snapper Island and on a clear day Port Douglas.

One final treat for the day is the crossing on the Daintree River Ferry – the iconic vehicle punt which transfers you out of the world heritage rainforest and on to your home-ward road. You will be back at your accommodation early in the evening.

Day 6

Free Day, Cairns

Today is at your leisure to either relax or take a ride on the Skyrail Gondola to Kuranda or visit Tjapukai and learn about the Aboriginal dreamtime.

Day 7

(D)

Uluru, Kata Tjuta & Sounds of Silence Dinner

This morning you will be met at your hotel and transferred to Cairns Airport. Upon arrival in Ayers Rock, you will be transferred to your accommodation.

Sounds of Silence is a truly unique Outback experience - the best of the Red Centre distilled into four magic hours. Here is an unforgettable evening, eating beautifully prepared food under the Outback sky. Guests are escorted to a special location shortly before sundown. A lone didgeridoo echoes across the desert as you enjoy champagne and canapés. While the sun sets in a blaze of reds and oranges, and well into the starlit night, you feast on array of

the Northern Territory's culinary delights, including barramundi, kangaroo, emu, crocodile, bush salads, and classic Australian desserts.

Attention then turns to some of the world's best stargazing, with the assistance of a resident astronomer. As you relax, coffee and tea are served. In winter, guests gather around a campfire to savor a special treat of hot mulled wine.

Day 8

Ayers Rock Sunrise & Alice Springs

One hour prior to Sunrise tour departs for Uluru Kata Tjuta National Park and head to the sunrise viewing site for approximately 45 minutes. Hot drinks



provided at Anangu Tours bus. After sunrise, tour continues on lap of Uluru (if time permits short walk at base of rock) Arrive at Cultural Centre for breakfast in upstairs restaurant.

After breakfast meet Aboriginal guide and Aboriginal language interpreter at the touch wall for the Liru Walk. Continue along the Liru Walk on foot learning the ancient history of

Uluru from your Aboriginal guides. Liru Walk is 2 hours/2 km easy walking.

Liru Walk ends near the base of Uluru, where you are met by your vehicle and driver. Farwell Anangu Guides at the Cultural Centre.

Continue on transfer back to your accommodation.

Return to your hotel before boarding your luxury coach early afternoon and travel through Yulara and Curtin Springs. See Mt Conner in the distance. This fascinating flat-topped mountain juts out of the surrounding desert plain, bearing witness to a period of massive uplift followed by eons of erosion. Head to the town at the heart of the Red Centre, Alice Springs. Pass through the striking Outback landscapes, including the extraordinary West MacDonnell Ranges, that show a spectacular array of sunburnt oranges, maroons and purples. Your Driver/Guide will provide an informative and entertaining commentary. Learn about the natural and geological history of the region, unique Australian desert flora and fauna, and some of the traditional customs and beliefs of the Aboriginal people.

Day 9

Western MacDonnell Ranges

Travel West from Alice Springs and experience some of the most spectacular scenery unique to Central Australia. Highlights include Anzac Hill, Flynn's Grave, Simpsons Gap and Standley Chasm. Be served Traditional Billy Tea boiled on an open campfire with a light picnic lunch. Passengers have the option on the return trip to town to visit the World Class Alice Springs Desert

Park where you will spend the afternoon looking through the Nocturnal House, Woodland, Sand Dune and Riverine Habitats plus the unforgettable Birds of Prey Show. Your guide will escort you into the park, and return for you after the Raptor Show at approximately 4:30pm.

Day 10

Adelaide

Transfer to Alice Springs airport for your flight to Adelaide. Upon arrival in Adelaide you will be met and taken to your historic Bed & Breakfast. This afternoon is free to visit this city's museums, Aboriginal culture center or the largest food market in the Southern Hemisphere!

Accommodation: Buxton Manor, One Bedroom – One Night

Day 11

Kangaroo Island

Fly to Kangaroo Island for a two day / one night tour including Bed & Breakfast accommodation, meals and 4WD touring. Kangaroo Island is the best place in Australia to view wildlife in their natural environment –



Koalas, kangaroos, echidnas, goannas, sea lions, fur seals,

abundant birdlife and amazing rock formations. A night time fairy penguin tour is optional this evening (additional cost).

Accommodation: Stranraer Homestead, Double Room – One night

Day 12

Kangaroo Island

This morning you will be met and transferred to Flinders Chase National Park. Here, kangaroos laze and Cape Barren geese graze. The Chase is home to all our varieties of native animals and birds. On to Admirals Arch, an ancient limestone formation close to the ocean, a perfect haul-out area for an active colony of the New Zealand fur seal. To Remarkable Rocks, via the spectacular coastline of Cape du Couedic, where the forces of nature have carved modern sculptures out of the granite. A short bush walk searching for the Echidna (spiny ant-eater) and observing the colourful Kangaroo Island endemic Crimson Rosella. Head back for a BBQ lunch of marinated steak, onions and potatoes, cooked in front of you by your guide (now turned chef!).



This is complimented by fresh salads, local KI wines and other refreshments. For dessert spoil yourself by indulging in our special Pears poached in KI red

wine, accompanied by KI's unique Sheep's Milk Yogurt. All this served in the bush, nestled amongst the beautiful tall Gum trees. After our meal, we head for Koala Avenue just outside the Park where Koalas are easily seen in the 'Manna Gums' that grow in the area. Your guide will then take you down a bush lined track and into 'Grassdale', part of the Kelly Hill Conservation Park. Here you will enjoy viewing the large 'mob' of Kangaroo's that graze the grassy flats and shelter in the surrounding bush. Also listen for the many parrot and other bird species that live in the tall gum trees. Wonder through some of the old relics that speak of a by gone era of early pioneer farming. Head for Vivonne Bay, with its crystal clear turquoise water. Your guide will take you to Point Ellen where you can fossick for shells on the beach and possibly sight a penguin in its rookery Our tour concludes with your departure at the airport, or return to your Island accommodation.

Day 13

Barossa Valley Wine Tasting

Head north from Adelaide towards the Barossa Valley, over the Torrens River and into the Torrens Gorge. We make our way to Williamstown and admire the beautiful stone buildings before having morning tea from the historic Lyndock bakery. Visit the Angas Park Fruit Co. at the charming stone brick town of Angaston, before admiring the panoramic views offered from Menglers Hill Lookout, which gives you fantastic photographic opportunities looking out onto the Barossa Valley.



Lunch will be at award winning Peter Lehman Wines and consist of a beautiful tasting plate of local meats and cheeses. The afternoon will then be spent amongst the vineyards and wineries that make this area so popular and famous around the world. This afternoon will be created to suit your palate. Whether you prefer the red or white, dry or sweet, our guide will discuss with everyone what they prefer and visit wineries appropriate to your taste. Finish the day with a stop to view the

most famous of all premium Australian wine, Grange.

Day 14

Melbourne

Transfer from your hotel to Adelaide airport. Upon arrival in Melbourne you will be transferred to your accommodation in Melbourne. This afternoon is at leisure for you to discover this beautiful city.

Accommodation: Crowne Promenade, Standard Room – Three nights

Day 15

Melbourne City Sights Tour & Colonial Tramcar Dinner

Travel through the government precinct and admire the Treasury Building, Windsor Hotel, State Parliament House, Royal Exhibition Building and Melbourne Museum. This leads to a couple of the inner northern suburbs. Fitzroy's Brunswick Street is very bohemian with a vast array of pubs, bars, restaurants, record shops and local designer shops. Carlton's Lygon Street is the Italian precinct and famous for its coffee and cakes, spaghetti restaurants, pizzerias and Ferraris.

Next is the Queen Victoria Markets (closed every Monday and Wednesday, Good Friday, Anzac Day, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day). This is more than just Melbourne's shopping mecca - it is a historic landmark, a tourist attraction and an institution for Melburnians. This is a good chance to mix with the locals, learn how to play the didgeridoo, as well as pick up some unique and great value Australian and Aboriginal gifts.

Morning tea will be amongst the glorious colours and smells of the Botanical Gardens. Magnificent expanses of lush green lawn slope elegantly towards ornamental lakes graced by elegant black swans and waterfowl; massive trees cast boughs of shade over manicured garden beds. This is a true haven within a busy city.



Drive past the sporting precinct that became famous with the 1956 Olympic Games and now roars to the cheers of Aussie Rules crowds each weekend. See the nearby Rod Laver Tennis Centre that hosts the Australian Tennis Open each year as well as the world famous MCG which has hosted most of the major events that have come to this city. Travelling westwards pass through the beautiful Victorian terraces of Albert Park, to the historic Station Pier in Port Melbourne. This was an arrival point of many of Melbourne's European immigrants.

Driving along Port Phillip Bay view locals walking dogs, rollerblading, cycling and kite boarding before arriving at remarkable St Kilda. Situated on one of the most picturesque points of the Bay this pretty bay side suburb is one of the main tourist destinations renowned for its sandy beaches, music venues, restaurants and cafe lifestyle. Enjoy breathtaking views of Melbourne's city skyline, West Gate Bridge and the Dandenong Ranges from an historic vantage point.

Drive through St Kilda's funky Acland and Fitzroy Streets before entering the Australian Formula One Grand Prix track at Albert Lake. Pretend you're in the driver's seat and motoring at 200 miles per hour. 'Safely' drive back into the city where you can enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure.

This evening make your way to the departure point for this evening's Colonial Tramcar Dinner, Tramstop #125 Normanby Road, near the corner of Clarendon Street in South Melbourne, across from the Crown Casino. Please arrive at least 10 minutes before departure for check-in.

The glossy, burgundy restaurants on wheels are the first traveling tramcar restaurants in the world and ensure a delightful innovative approach to dining. As you cruise the scenic streets of Melbourne, you can enjoy fine cuisine and drink the very best of Australian wines or make a selection from

the fully stocked bar at a fully inclusive price. The atmosphere is cozy, the service friendly and the decor as inviting as the colonial period these trams reflect.

Day 16

Great Ocean Road

Travel to Geelong and head down to Corio Bay, a wonderful mix of old wharves, wool stores and a fully restored 1930s sea-bathing complex. At Torquay the Great Ocean Road starts. Known as the world's most inspiring coastal drive, you will follow its winding trail through the lush Otway rainforests, to the breathtaking, windswept drama of the Shipwreck Coast. Upon arrival at Lorne visit a lookout perched high on the hillside where you



really get to see the Great Ocean Road from a bird like perspective. This will be followed by morning tea where you can possibly view some of the local surfers 'ripping it up.'

A sumptuous lunch is served at Apollo Bay before arrival at the Shipwreck Coast area of the

Great Ocean Road. First stop is at the "12 Apostles". The mighty Apostles are world-recognized icons of the Great Ocean Road. These giant rock stacks soar from the swirling waters of the Southern Ocean and are a central feature of the spectacular Port Campbell National Park.

Venturing further west arrive at Loch Ard Gorge. Your first view will be of towering cliffs, sparkling blue-green sea and a small, sandy beach. It's hard to imagine that the drama of one of Victoria's most tragic shipwrecks was played out at this very spot more than 120 years ago, giving its name to the gorge.

Day 17

(B)

Sydney City Tour

This morning you will transfer to Melbourne airport. Upon arrival in Sydney, you will be transferred to your Sydney accommodation.

Enjoy a half day Sydney City Tour this afternoon that captures all of the highlights of this amazing harbor city, including the historic Rocks precinct, Darling Harbour, Macquaire's Chair and Bondi Beach to name a few.

Day 18

Sydney Harbour Seafood Luncheon Cruise

This morning you have free time before making your own way to Circular Quay to board a Captain Cook Cruise. Cruise aboard Sydney's flagship MV Sydney 2000. Enjoy stunning views, a comprehensive commentary and a delicious seafood buffet lunch. The rest of your day is at leisure to visit museums, the aquarium or perhaps climb the Sydney Harbour Bridge or enjoy an evening performance at the Sydney Opera House. (Additional Cost).



Day 19

Blue Mountains & Wildlife Park

The day begins at Featherdale Wildlife Park where you'll have the run of the Park before official opening hours. After breakfast enjoy meeting Australian animals including kangaroos, emus, wombats, dingoes and more. Depart Featherdale Park and travel to the Blue Mountains, Tomah Botanic Gardens and a stop at Mt Banks. Here you'll take a short nature walk while the native flora is described.

From this point you'll cross the mountains to Mt Victoria and enjoy a buffetstyle lunch at the Historic Imperial Hotel. After lunch continue on to Govetts Leap for magnificent valley and waterfall views and then on to see the views of spectacular Megalong Valley and the Three Sisters.

Traveling down the mountain you'll head into the national park to Euroka Clearing and view kangaroos in their natural environment while enjoying a glass of champagne. Drive to the Olympic Site for a short tour followed by a return transfer to your accommodation.

Sydney at Leisure

Today is free to explore Sydney at your own pace.

Today you will be transferred from your hotel to Sydney Airport for your flight back home.
